



Mussels in the water!

- Awareness of the plight of the Gulf. The Hauraki Gulf Forum *big goal* of 1,000 sq.km of restored shellfish beds.
- Central govt Revitalising the Gulf strategy. HPAs, active habitat restoration & Ahu Moana.
- Changing attitudes in recreational fishers, e.g. death of the dredge, limiting take, MPAs
- Recognition of the value of Te Ao Māori values & perspectives, e.g. rāhui, kaitiakitanga.

- Rising awareness and interest in marine conservation & restoration. NGOs taking action.
- Mana whenua as kaitiaki keen to take a leadership role in a post-settlement era.
- Volunteers and citizen scientists from wider community keen to lend a hand.
- Developing know-how from western science, mātauranga, aquaculture and engineering.

- Philanthropic funding (yay boomers!)
- The Challenge Fund The Nature Conservancy & Foundation North
- The Hauraki Gulf Regeneration Fund Auckland Foundation
